


#### Your input and opinions matter. We are listening!

## RESTORATION OF BROWN AND ART HALLS AT TUCKER

\$4 million

Tucker is the central meeting and dining facility for those who stay in the cottages Uphill. This complex includes Brown Hall, Art Hall, Tucker Lodge, the Bird Cage, dining rooms and a kitchen.



Originally built to host 120 people, today's groups can reach up to 300 people. It is our intention to restore and expand Brown and Art Halls and the surrounding landscape to better meet current and future community needs while giving our guests the best and most accessible place to gather and giving the art a better home. We have planned this with great care, listening to our guests and striving to stay true to Dr. Woodward's vision of the complex inside and out. ### RENOVATION OF LEXINGTON HOUSE

\$500,000

Lexington is a 19th century house, acquired with the Orkney Springs Hotel. This historic building can host up to 15 people, with numerous bedrooms, bathrooms and porches. Currently, there is need for a renovation to ensure the preservation and continued use of the house. The foundation needs major repairs and the interior will be updated to be a more welcoming and accommodating space for guests.



# STRUCTURAL UPDATES TO SHELTER CHAPEL & SHRINE \$100,000


The Shelter Chapel is part of the Shrine complex and was dedicated and consecrated in 1936 to be used as a worship space in inclement weather. The chapel is a favorite of many because of its cozy ambience. Due to its age and construction, the Shelter Chapel and the adjacent fishpond need structural work and repointing to ensure the long-term sustainability and safety of the chapel.





### **POOL** \$50,000

Built in 2000, this zero-entry pool has lap lanes and is 25 meters long. The pool is open to Shrine Mont guests from Memorial Day to Labor Day and continues to be one of the most popular amenities on the Mountain. Maintenance on the pool is essential to its continued functionality. The pool is scheduled to be resurfaced in 2028/2029, which would include draining, fixing/replacing the tiles and mending cracks, and repainting.



#### REBUILDING THE CROSS \$150.000

The Cross and observation tower located on the south ridge of Spring Mountain provide guests with views of the Blue Ridge and Great North mountains. Hiking to the Cross is one of the most popular activities at Shrine Mont. The cross needs to be rebuilt to address potential safety concerns and to make sure that all can continue to enjoy it for generations to come.

### **RESURRECTING THE UPPER POND** \$250,000

"The Lake" was built in 1967 to give guests and campers a place to fish and canoe and was quite popular. After the base of the dam began to leak, the Lake fell out of use and became the "Dead Sea". We envision bringing this Upper Pond back to use for popular water activities up the hill. This will also give Shrine Mont access to the other side of the pond where there is undeveloped land that Shrine Mont could use in the future for various purposes, such as staff housing and more winter cottages. Fixing the pond now would allow us to put infrastructure through the dam to serve those properties in the future.





### **RENOVATING THE LOWER PAVILION** S1 Million

This pavilion is a wonderful location for outdoor events in case of rain and is best known as the home of the Shenandoah Valley Music Festival. The Lower Pavilion needs to be renovated with electrical improvements and overall cosmetic updates to be a better venue for professional concerts and a true multipurpose facility for large gatherings, lectures, athletic events such as basketball and more.

#### **BUILDING THE ENDOWMENT**

\$10 million

The growth of our endowment, currently at \$3 million, is critical to our sustainability for the future. This income stream can sustain Shrine Mont with invaluable financial support, maintaining programs and staff and — most importantly - keeping our rates family friendly for generations to come.

It is our long-term goal to grow Shrine Mont's endowment to \$10 million to provide financial stability, strengthen donor trust, fund programs and enhance facilities. Often, wills and bequests can leave transformational gifts that will ensure Shrine Mont will be here to celebrate 200 years!

At Shrine Mont, we believe in strengthening our community, both in Orkney Springs and beyond. As such, it is important for any potential campaign to reach outside of our physical center, and push into the underserved communities around us and throughout the commonwealth.

One component we are asking for feedback on is taking 10% of funds raised to invest back into our communities. This initiative would not only invite underserved communities to Shrine Mont but, more importantly, physically have us go into their communities. This pilgrimage would allow Shrine Mont to walk alongside others, becoming true partners. It is our hope to bring transformative changes to not only these individuals, but also our staff, campers and all those who love Shrine Mont.

Note: As with all of our projects, the exact scope and details of what this could look like will depend on current and future conversations with our board, staff, donors and the stakeholders of Shrine Mont.

#### WHAT IS POSSIBLE

Shrine Mont is a place where people are more important than things, where prayer and reflection, rest and recreation are more important than appointments and tasks. It's a place where people give thanks to God for his creation—from the beauty of the streams, flowers and wildlife which are at home here, to the people who come to this place to celebrate being part of the family of God.

As Shrine Mont celebrates our Centennial in 2025, we are embarking on a discovery phase called a feasibility study. Through this process we are excited to collaborate with our community to share our strategic vision, discuss programming and facility goals, and ask for thoughtful feedback.


